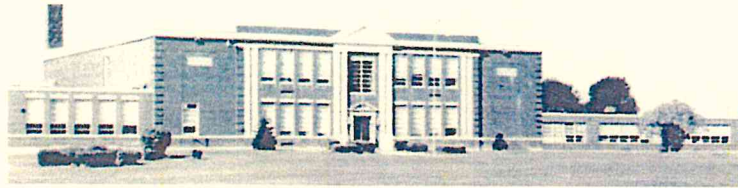

1. Mr. Mitchell discussed the Reopening Plan at length. He noted that 87% of the student population responded to the survey (approximately 400 students) stating the students would return to the building and 13% (approximately 60 students) opted for fully remote learning. There will be approximately 200 students in each of the cohorts (blue and white) and the majority of the parents opted to transport their own children to and from school. Approximately 70 people attended the parent information nights. There will be a faculty and staff Q & A on Thursday at 3 pm. He thanked the Reopening Committee and the leadership team for all the hard work in making this plan detailed and successful.
2. Mr. Mitchell discussed the disputed property line and that it was determined that the property in question was indeed in the Madison Central School District boundaries and the board is not interested in relinquishing this property to another district.

He shared that one teacher will be teaching fully remote this year. He shared that he is working with OT scheduling and working on adjusting specials so that both cohorts are able to benefit from PE, Art, Library and Music within the hybrid schedule.
 - 2. Mr. Nichols discussed completed and upcoming professional development. He shared that 6th grade orientation is being planned and that it will be a split event dividing the grade into groups for the orientation. He discussed the change in the use of lockers for the storage of coats and boots and the use of backpacks. Mr. Lee has been working hard to develop schedules that work with the two cohorts and Distance Learning opportunities are still planned but are also contingent upon the school offering those programs and changes made on the provider's side affect our ability to take advantage of such offerings. Every attempt will be made to continue to offer our students as much as possible.

As our member schools begin a start of the academic year in the midst of the Pandemic please be advised your SBI also needs to adjust our calendar to meet current state regulations and keep our members healthy and safe.

To that end please be advised of the following:

Executive Committee meeting will be held on Thursday, September 17th beginning at 6:00 p. m. via a Zoom conference. Please send in your representative to Charley as soon as possible with an e-mail contact. We will send out the contact information a week before our meeting.

Our first General Membership meeting, which was scheduled for Thursday, September 24th, **is cancelled.** We were going to honor our May 2020 SAA and SDA recipients at that meeting. Given the current regulations regarding the number of participants at a gathering we do not want to be in violation of that limit.

We will contact our SAA students, nominators and see what method they would prefer to honor our students. We will do an in-person award while maintaining social distancing, a zoom conference and / or whatever method the parents would agree to. We will notify the schools involved, regarding the date and format, tape the award presentation and place it on our SBI web site. If our nominators are unable to attend the presentation either President Michael Head or myself will read it as part of the ceremony.

We will present our 2 DSA awards in the same format and again tape it for placement on our web site.

We are currently scheduling our Meet the Candidates legislative program. Again in keeping with the limited numbers allowed at gatherings we are scheduling individual sessions based on the current NYS Assembly and Senate legislative districts. As of now we are planning to be in a Zoom format. Our legislative committee members will have prepared questions for the individual legislators. We will send out the meeting times and zoom contacts for all members if you would like to attend one of the sessions. It is our hope that schools in the individual districts will take the lead in the meetings. We again hope to tape the sessions and place it on our web site for members who are not able to attend the zoom meeting. There are currently 2 candidates on the November ballot for the Assembly Districts 121

(Salka) , 119 (Buttenschon) and 101 (Miller) and Senate Districts 49 (Tedisco), 51 (Senator Seward) 53 (May).

Also attached to this correspondence is a list of our current Legislative Committee members, listing of our member schools and their NYS Assembly and Senate representative and a contact sheet for our NYS legislators.

SBI schools that are NYSSBA members have been contacted regarding the annual convention. It will be held virtually over a 2-week period. Our November General Membership meeting will focus on how the Oneida – Madison – Herkimer regions reopening plans have progressed, what has worked and areas that need to be addressed as well as virtual learning platforms that are available to our schools and our students.

Memorandum of Agreement

THIS AGREEMENT dated this 8th day of September 2020, is entered into by and between the Madison Central School District (hereinafter referred to as “the District”) and the Madison Teachers’ Association (hereinafter referred to as “the Association”).

WHEREAS a state of emergency has been declared by New York State concerning the outbreak of the COVID-19 virus; and,

WHEREAS the prevalence of COVID-19 is reducing throughout New York State; and,

WHEREAS, even with such remission, it is anticipated that certain health related requirements and recommendations will be made by governing officials and agencies for schools to operate; and,

WHEREAS, the District and the Association recognize that many adjustments will be necessary to the routine operation of the District in order to comply with the health-related requirements and recommendations in order to operate schools; and,

WHEREAS, it is expected that throughout the 2020-21 school year multiple adjustments and may be necessary in form, frequency and modality for delivery of instruction, resulting the parties anticipating a need to revisit this agreement throughout the year for updates and adjustments,

The parties do hereby agree as follows:


1. Cameras in the classroom will be used for the primary purpose of providing instruction to students in the District.
2. Teachers will be provided with the necessary training to use cameras as an effective instructional tool and will not be required to use them without proper training.
3. The classroom teacher, and/or an appropriate staff member under the direction of the teacher, will be responsible for control of the camera(s) in the classroom.
4. The use of cameras, either as a livestream or recorded lessons, shall not result in the reduction of staff in part or in whole.
5. The District will not use such recorded or livestream instructional video to replace the announced, unannounced, or walk through observations provided in the APPR Plan. In the event that the District moves to full remote learning, and using video is the only means of observing a teacher’s performance, video observations may become necessary.
6. The District shall not review recorded instructional video looking for misconduct. Should a question be raised of unprofessional conduct in the classroom, a proper, administrative investigation will take place. In the event that the investigative results remain inconclusive, cameras may be viewed as a last resort.
7. This Memorandum of Agreement will become effective upon the date of its ratification by the respective parties.

8. All terms and conditions of the collective bargaining agreement between the District and the Association are in full force and effect. Entering into this agreement shall not modify the collective bargaining agreement. Rather, this Agreement shall apply only for the specific and limited purpose of addressing the unique challenges presented by the outbreak of COVID-19 during the 2020-21 school year. The parties agree to continually assess the situation as it is highly fluid and as such, it should be renewed and/or adjusted per semester. It shall not set any precedent or practice regarding any aspect of the Agreement. This Agreement shall be reviewed and be of no further force and effect upon the conclusion of the academic semester, January 29th, 2021, unless extended in writing by the parties.
9. Nothing contained in the Memorandum of Agreement may be used by either party to make a claim that a past practice has been established. The parties further understand and agree that this agreement is non-precedent setting.
10. In the event there is a dispute as to the interpretation or application of this Memorandum of Agreement, said dispute shall be resolved using the parties negotiated grievance procedure.

MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT, dated this 1st day of September, 2020, by and between the Madison Central School District, with its administrative offices and official place of business located at 7303 State Route 20, Madison, New York 13402 (hereinafter "Madison CSD" or "District") and the Madison Non-Instructional Employees' Association, with its mailing address at 7303 State Route 20, Madison, New York 13402 (hereinafter "Madison Non-Instructional Employees' Association" or "Association").

RECITAL

WHEREAS, the Madison CSD and the Madison Non-Instructional Employees' Association are parties to a collective bargaining agreement that governs the terms and conditions of employment of the non-instructional support staff employed by the District, which collective bargaining agreement extends from July 1, 2017 through to June 30, 2021; and

WHEREAS, the parties recognize that effective December 31, 2020, the minimum wage in the State of New York will be increased from its current rate of \$11.80 to \$12.50; and

WHEREAS, this increase to the minimum wage rate will affect the starting salary rate of a variety of positions in the parties' collective bargaining agreement; and

WHEREAS, the District has recommended, and the Association has agreed, that in lieu of waiting for this rate increase for the affected positions to become effective in the middle of the school year, that the parties agree and stipulate to modify the Step 1 wage rate in the contract for the positions affected to be increased to this new minimum wage rate of \$12.50 effective as of September 1, 2020, commensurate with the start of the new school year; and

WHEREAS, it is the desire of the parties to memorialize this understanding into written form; now, therefore

IT IS HEREBY AGREED AS FOLLOWS:

- (1) The parties agree that effective September 1, 2020, the minimum starting wage rate for the positions of Cleaner, Food Service Helper, Teacher Aide/Monitor, and Office Assistant 1/Teacher Aide, as set forth at Article 17 of the parties' Collective Bargaining Agreement, entitled "Salaries," will be increased from their current rate of \$12.43 to \$12.50.
- (2) The parties agree that this Agreement is based on the unique circumstances of this matter, and is not intended or deemed to establish a precedent for future grievances, improper practice proceedings, or other actions or proceedings, shall set no precedent whatsoever and shall not bind any Party in any future matter.
- (3) The terms and conditions of this Agreement are governed by the Laws of the State of New York.

- (4) The parties agree that the invalidity or unenforceability of any provision hereto shall in no way affect the validity or enforceability of any other provision.
- (5) This agreement may not be amended, modified, or revised in any manner without the express written consent of the parties.
- (6) This Agreement shall take effect upon execution.

Library Book Weeding Rationale

Attached and linked to this document is a [list of titles](#) I am requesting to be surplus and then removed from our library's collection. After removal the books will be offered to our students to take home. The list is extensive because this is the first time I have weeded since becoming the librarian at Madison Central. The shelves can get over-crowded which leaves little room for adding to the collection. At this point in time, the section that has been weeded is in the elementary non-fiction section. The goal is to continue to examine other sections during the remainder of the school year and in the future to maintain a relevant collection for students and staff to use.

In making the weeding choices, I looked at several factors of each book:

- The condition (yellow pages, significantly warped)
- The circulation history (some titles have not been checked out in several years)
- The relation to the curriculum
- The timeliness of the book
- Is it a multiple copy title that is no longer popular

In making these decisions, I have examined weeding guidelines through BOCES School Library System and also through professional sources such as School Library Journal to ensure that I could be as thoughtful and methodical as possible.

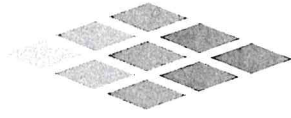
